

From the Director of Faith Formation

Greetings, Boozhoo, Quina Monthe!

Affirmation Two: Listening for God's Word, which comes through daily prayer and meditation, studying the ancient testimonies which we call Scripture, and attending to God's present activity in the world.

The first half of Affirmation Two tells us we affirm the Path of Jesus when we engage in daily prayer and meditation, and in personal and community study and interpretation of Scripture. According to the authors, prayer outranks studying Scripture if what we are seeking is direct contact with God. Even Jesus had incomplete knowledge of God's will for him. The Gospels give at least 25 <u>explicit</u> instances where Jesus is engaged in prayer. For those of you into Bible metrics, that's 9 in Matthew, 8 in Mark, 15 in Luke, and 4 in John.

Most biblical scholars believe this an underestimate of the frequency of Jesus' prayer life because the Gospel writers often alluded to Jesus' habit of praying without providing any details. Luke 5:15-16 is a good example: "But now more than ever the word about Jesus spread abroad; many crowds would gather to hear him and to be cured of their diseases. But he would withdraw to deserted places and pray." And Mark 1:35: "In the morning, while it was still very dark, he got up and went out to a deserted place, and there he prayed."

Prayer was not an occasional activity Jesus engaged in; prayer was more a state of being – a continuous dialogue with God that shaped his actions, decisions, and relationships. Prayer was Jesus' primary spiritual practice. Sometimes Jesus' engaged in short episodes of prayer; for example, at the raising of Lazarus (John 11:41-42), and in teaching his disciples The Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13).

Jesus also engaged in extended periods of prayer. In Luke 6:12-13, Jesus went to the mountain to pray "and he spent the night in prayer to God. And when day came, he called his disciples and chose twelve of them, whom he also named apostles." In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus returned to his disciples and found them sleeping: "So, could you not stay awake with me one hour?" Jesus and the disciples would repeat this scene two more times before Jesus is arrested.

Imagine, Jesus, the Son of God, needing to spend his life in ongoing, continuous dialogue with God! Well, the Phoenix Affirmation authors suggest that for you and I to have a "true, ongoing relationship with God," we "need to spend thirty minutes each day in prayer." But only if we hope to or want to affirm the Path of Jesus.

Prayer And Meditation - Thirty Minutes Every Day?!

The Phoenix Affirmation authors anticipated readers might have "good" reasons to explain why it is impossible to engage in thirty minutes of daily prayer – reasons like, "I can't possibly fit another thing into my schedule!"

But we all know that thirty minutes goes by quickly when we are doing something we love. In fact, you and I will <u>find</u> thirty minutes, no matter how busy we are, to do that thing we love. Some of us can be downright fervently religious about consuming the sports section, binge watching a Netflix series or movie, playing our favorite online game on laptop or smartphone, or [add your thing here].

Would you believe me if I told you prayer is more important than television and is as interesting and endlessly creative as sex? No? Good. I would never make such a claim.



The authors do make that claim (see page 27), even though prayer can, on some days, feel like a chore where nothing happens. Sometimes prayer does offer an immediate response. But if what we are looking for is a true, ongoing relationship with God, we will probably need to do less talking and more listening than we are used to doing – for more than one day.

[T]he basic stance in prayer is that of deep listening, and there may not be a lot of action on God's part that is immediately perceptible. The experience may be more like the sound of falling snow. You do not hear directly the sound of falling snow. What you hear, if you are paying attention, is the change of acoustics in your surroundings. God's voice is not something we often perceive directly. Rather, we perceive it by noticing how our perception of everything else changes in response. (p.27)

I will share information about various prayer techniques I have tried and/or currently use during the month of September. Look for the <u>links</u> to this information in the e-News and Sunday bulletins. I would be interested in hearing your experiences with prayer, so feel free to share them with me and with others.

Minutes of Church Council Meeting First Congregational UCC, Menomonie, WI

July 15, 2025

Role Call: Luci Black (Membership/Fellowship), Kathy Colvin (Worship), Sherry Galetka (Stewardship), Melissa Kluge (Christian Education), René Mehlberg (Pastor), Rick Nagler (Vice Moderator), Jeanne Rothaupt (Moderator), Tom Schmelzle (Treasurer), Deanna Schultz (Music), Lee Theorin (Property) and Agnes Welsch (Mission). Andrew Mercil (Past Moderator), Jill Schwebs (Clerk) and Margi Stauss (Care Ministries) were not present. Also attending: Karen Miller (Director of Faith Formation).

The Council was called to order at 11:35 a.m. by moderator, Jeanne Rothaupt.

Sherry moved to approve the Council Agenda. Luci seconded the motion, and it was approved.

Agnes led the group in prayer.

- 1. The consent agenda, including June 1 minutes, July Treasurer's report and deacon reports, was approved. (Motion by Kathy, Rick seconded)
- 2. Pastor René presented a Personnel Committee request to add an IT committee that would assess the church technology and ongoing support needed, including personnel. Pastor René will coordinate committee membership, with the Council vice-moderator as a member. The request was approved (Motion by Tom, Kathy seconded).
- **3.** Agnes presented a request from the Mission, Peace and Justice Committee for our church to become a "Creation Justice Church." This is a UCC designation with a focus on addressing issues related to environmental degradation and the social impact. Our church is already doing many of the things needed to meet this designation. This would require approval at a congregational meeting, after which we could apply for grants.
 - A motion was made by Kathy, seconded by Sherry, for the committee to pursue the application and determine when it could go before the congregation for approval. The motion was approved.
- **4.** Jeanne requested that an auditing committee be formed, with Lavonne Solem and Kim Blomquist as its members (both volunteered). The request was approved (Motion by Agnes, Luci seconded).
- **5.** Luci led a discussion about the August 5 pie social and what time to set up. That is the same night as National Night Out which will be in Wilson Park from 5:30-7:30pm. Consensus of the Council was that set-up occur early, beginning at 5:00pm at the church and a sign with the start time for serving be posted at the shelter.
 - Additional help will be needed and there are sign-up sheets by the West entrance.
 - Lee will ask the Building and Grounds committee if someone could provide a truck to transport things from church to the park.
 - For this and other events, Luci will seek environmentally friendly options for serving dishes and utensils.
- **6.** Council discussed a Costco membership and how to coordinate its usage.
 - Membership card must be in a person's name, someone representing the organization, and that person has to be there when purchases are made.
 - Karen Miller has a card for First Congregational that is tax-exempt; anyone who wants to shop there must contact Karen and she'll arrange to go shopping with them.
 - Everyone on Council should have a tax-exempt card for any purchases they might make for the church, or there is one in the office.
- 7. Jeanne requested approval to move forward with the "Together for Tomorrow" Planned Giving Initiative. A copy of the plan was provided to the Council. The goal is to build the endowment for the church. The

initiative will have a participation goal rather than a dollar amount. Kick-off will be Rally Sunday. The request was approved (Motion by Sherry, Deanna seconded).

- 8. Sherry asked the Council if they could meet another day to start planning the Fall kickoff/Rally Sunday (September 14). The Council will meet on Tuesday, July 29 at 11:30am in Room 1 for that planning meeting.
- **9.** Melissa provided an update on the Kids Camp scheduled for August 13-15 from 1:00-4:00pm. Additional helpers are needed. There will be/are sign up sheets.

Sherry Galetka (Stewardship) and Agnes Welsch (Mission) were not present.

The Council was called to order at 11:30 a.m. by moderator, Jeanne Rothaupt.

Deanna led the group in prayer.

- **1.** The consent agenda, including the July 15th minutes, the August Treasurer's Report and Deacon Reports, was approved. (Motion by Andrew, and seconded by Deanna.)
- 2. Action Items
 - a. Lee discussed the need for replacement of one of the air conditioners. Lee moved that the purchase for \$7,555 be approved and Cathy seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

- f. Andrew and Lucy have been working on a refrigerator magnet for major dates in the church year. It should be ready in September.
- g. There was discussion about conflicts between Bridge Sunday and the choir. Deanne moved that after September, Bridge Sunday be moved to the second Sunday of each month. Luci seconded the motion and it was passed
- h. The Funeral Memorial Form needs to be updated. Fees need to be adjusted. A need for bulletin fee and a dishwasher fee. The fee for the minister and janitor needs to be adjusted if there is no funeral director. The new form will be presented in September.
